Patients in Isolation Precautions

- Adhere to Infection Control & Hospitality policy when cleaning the patient's room who is in Contact, Droplet, Airborne or Airborne/AFB isolation precautions.



Prior to entering room - Clean Hands!



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Assist patient on gurney/wheelchair /bed



Gloves are not required for routine patient transport



Arrival at destination gurney/wheelchair /bed left at destination



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Clean hands on exit



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Taking gurney for next assignment



- *Clean hands on exit*
- *Don gloves*
- *Clean gurney*
- *Remove glove*
- *Clean hands*
